

NATHAN WINOGRAD NO KILL SEMINAR

On April 3rd, Brevard County's Daphne Foundation and Space Coast No More Homeless Pets (SCNMHP) are hosting a No Kill seminar led by leading No Kill proponent Nathan Winograd. Winograd is the author of two authoritative books on the "No Kill Equation" (*Redemption and Irreconcilable Differences*). His seminar is titled "Building a No Kill Community." Attendees will learn about the programs and services that make No Kill possible, what communities have been successful, and why. This is the seminar that has been called "a prerequisite for animal lovers, rescue groups and organizations that are serious about changing their communities to No Kill."

The time is now ripe for the presentation of this seminar. Brevard's present county commissioners have endorsed the implementation of the No Kill philosophy at our two county-run shelters. The new director of Brevard Animal Services and Enforcement is Michael McFarland. He has a record of humanely administering animal shelters in California. He and a new volunteer coordinator are making major changes, and the shelters are beginning to attract volunteers imbued with the No Kill spirit.

The seminar will be held at 6:00 PM on the campus of Florida Institute of Technology (FIT). FIT is located in Melbourne. Admission is \$8.00. Admission is free to anyone purchasing a copy of *Irreconcilable Differences* (Mr. Winograd's latest book) from Daphne Foundation. The cost of the book is \$20 (\$22 including postage). Mr. Winograd will sign your copy at the seminar. Admission will be free for salaried, shelter employees but registration is necessary.

A venue has been reserved, but it may be necessary to change it to one with more seating if demand warrants it. As an event providing important public education for animal advocates, as many persons as possible should be able to attend. Therefore, registrants must include an email address and/or telephone number along with their checks. The precise location (on the FIT campus) will be announced within a month of the seminar.
